
Water Conservation is Critical

Summer Water Use Recommendations

Colorado has a semi-arid climate, and that makes water one of our most precious resources. Save money on your water bill by following these tips to conserve water.



Water only three days a week



Never water between 10:00 am and 6:00 pm



Never water when it's windy



Use rain barrels to supplement the water needs of plants



Repair leaking sprinkler systems quickly



Do not let water spray on concrete and asphalt



Use a hose nozzle with a shut-off valve when washing your car



Monitor and control your water use with SMART controllers and *Eye on Wat*

Lawn Watering Times

These times are based on a sprinkler system
