END TO IRRIGATION SEASON OCT 1.



CMWC collection and service areas, continue to face severe drought conditions, with historically high temperatures, low stream flows, and reservoir storage is below normal. As a result we are following Denver Water's lead and declaring a formal end to irrigation season October 1st.

Current drought restrictions remain in effect until the board determines how and when irrigation can resume. That means sprinklers need to remain off in the Spring of 2027 until further notice.

What is allowed after Sept. 30

- ✓ Hand watering of trees, shrubs, perennials, annuals, and vegetables with a hose with a shut-off nozzle, or low-volume, non-spray irrigation (such as a drip system), is permitted until the first frost. No watering between 10am and 6pm.
- ✗ Grass establishment is not allowed after Sept. 30.
- ✓ An irrigation system may be operated for installation, repair, or reasonable maintenance, so long as the system is attended throughout the period of operation and water waste does not occur.

Through September 30th, customers are still required to follow mandatory watering restrictions of two assigned days per week, per the current drought restrictions in place.
